Infrastructural facilities	-Improved accessibility;	-New territorial structure;	-Urban sprawl; -Congestion;			



Know how	- Improved management skills;	-Excellence in organizing events;	-Loss of skills;		





The urban space of Torino






Possible Scenarios

Scenarios (*)	Areas	Activities	Relationship between areas
1)Inertial re-use of facilities	 Competition mountain districts; Competition Turin districts; 	Strenghthening of existing single activities;	0
2)New international position	Susa Valley and Pragelato;Torino;	Strenghthening of the network of existing and new first-rate activities (culture districts, cinema, museums, alpine tourism etc.);	+
3)"Creative maturity" (*) IRES	Turin;Mid lands;Susa, Chisone and Germanasca Valleys;	Improving of qualified services for a regional demand (mountains as leisure places, soft/cultural tourism, quality of environment, etc.);	++




Inertial re-use of facilities





New international position




